

Dear colleague,

Thank you for your interest in taking part in the ESU's Action Research programme. This exciting programme, run in conjunction with academics at the University of Durham and the University of Sussex, is designed to support schools to develop their in-house research capacity and contribute to collective understanding of 'what works' in oracy-based classroom practice.

It is an opportunity for your school to work with others across England and Wales, on a tenmonth project, supported by CPD and expert advice. The project will culminate in a published report and conference and the sharing of research findings, ideas, and innovation not just in the UK, but to be shared internationally.

Read on to find out more about how your school can get involved.

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Project aims	 To develop action research skills in the field of oracy To improve outcomes for learners To support the development of oracy teaching practice To add to the oracy research base in a practical way
Participating Schools	Up to 20 state schools or colleges that have engaged with ESU programmes or shown a keen interest in oracy development, and winners or schools in receipt of a commendation from the ESU Oracy Culture Award.
Programme length	The programme will run from December 2024 - September 2025, with a conference in the autumn of 2025 to share findings. Schools will be engaged in active research from February-July, with the summer period designed to allow for the writing up of research findings and reports.
School commitment	One or two lead practitioners to engage in the programme from December 2024 - September 2025 (and autumn conference) as follows: • Engagement with pre-reading and research to shape initial research ideas between December 2024 and January 2025 • Attendance at launch CPD event in London, January 2025 • Engagement in ½ termly online project meetings • Development and delivery of action research project (one per school) • Production of research report • Participation in end of project conference
CPD and expert guidance	Expert guidance and CPD will be provided throughout the programme by the ESU and the University of Durham and the University of Sussex team. This will ensure your lead practitioner(s) develops essential skills in areas including: • Action research - overview, how to, question setting • Research ethics • Undertaking action research and capturing data • Good practice in oracy education

Who else will engage	This is a cross-phase (primary, secondary and further education) project open to state funded schools by application. A maximum of 20 schools and colleges will be accepted onto the project.
Cost	The programme is funded by the ESU. CPD, project group meetings, report production and conference costs will be met. Participating schools commit to release colleagues for attendance and to meet the cost of travel to/from London for the in-person events. We also request a £40 contribution from successful schools to help cover some of the costs of the CPD day. Should your school be unable to meet travel or contribution costs please contact us, as we may be able to offer some support.

I very much hope that your school will want to apply to be part of this new and exciting venture. Working with other schools in this way is an excellent opportunity to improve outcomes, develop capacity, knowledge, and expertise within our shared field of work and I hope your school will benefit.
